

Colebrook Roads – Sandy Brook Rd.

Sept. 24, 1877 At a town meeting the motion was made by Gen. E. A. Phelps that the selectmen be instructed to erect a bridge across the stream near the lately burned dwelling house of George Burkett [*148 Sandy Brook Road.*] at a cost not to exceed forty dollars (\$40.00) and that the town should not be held responsible for future repairs.

April 27, 1922 At a special town meeting, voters were asked to resolve whether or not to repair or replace the bridge on Sandy Brook near the residence of the late Anson Barnes. [*This location is now 334 Sandy Brook Road.*]

Oct. 3, 1927 At the annual town meeting, the voters were asked to see if the town will pay Carrington Phelps one dollar (\$1.00) annually to rent a short road by Hog's Back near Sandy Brook. [It was voted to postpone indefinitely.]

[This refers to the old alignment on the curve just east of the Town Garage by the large pine tree.]

Dec. 6, 1927 At a special town meeting the voters were asked to see if the town will pay ½ or some other amount toward repairing the bridge over Sandy Brook leading to Ellis Mattson's house. [*148 Sandy Brook Rd.*] It was voted to pay him \$100.00 and to pay him \$5.00 yearly toward maintaining the bridge.
